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2 1/2 Hr. 10-Curves Trip - 10 Miles

Put in at Ten Curves Public access. The current here is slow. In a few minutes you'll pass under a bridge and at about the 1/2 mile point you'll come to a small dam. Take your watercraft out of the river on the right bank and carry it around the dam. The distance is about 40 feet and is not difficult. This is private property, do not stop here but immediately resume your trip. After about one more mile the Fox River enters the Manistique from the right. Follow the current to the left. The river gets wider and deeper and the current increases to about 4-6 MPH. The river depth will range from 2-10 feet. Please use caution. About 2 hours into the trip you'll pass a large home on your left. In about 15 minutes, you'll come to an island. Take the small channel around it on the far right. Passage on the left can be difficult. Shortly thereafter, you'll arrive back at Northland Outfitters. Take out on the right at our launch ramp. Remember to always wear your life jacket.

4 Hr. Seney Refuge Trip - 15 Miles

Put in at our launch ramp after you set up a pick up time with a member of our staff. In about 15-20 minutes, or about 1/2 mile, you'll pass under the Ten Curves Rd. Bridge. In another 20-25 minutes or 2 more miles you'll pass under the M-77 Bridge and enter the Seney Wildlife Refuge. From this point to the landing site is wilderness, with no roads or development. Three small streams enter the river from the right and are marked with signs. Look for these signs to judge your distance. The first is Gray's Creek (mile 5), the second is Pine Creek (mile 8) which is approximately half way. From Driggs River you'll have approximately 15-20 more minutes of paddling before the take out at Mead Creek. The take-out location is on the LEFT side at a CONCRETE RAMP. Take out beside the ramp. If you look up Mead Creek you'll see a wooden bridge with a white sign that reads "Mead Creek". On the other side of the creek you'll see campsites on a hill. A member of our staff will meet you at the landing and bring you back to our headquarters.

Manistique River

Twisting, sandy bottomed, natural river with submerged logs and low-hanging branches. Current 4-6 mph. Depth 2-10 ft. Always wear your life jacket.
